Live Music for Dancing continued...

**So why go to the trouble and expense of having live music?**  
Because it's live, not canned. Because the music and the dancing grew up together, executed by actual living, breathing people. When done well a live-music night is fresh, juicy and rewarding. Dancers and musicians catch one another's excitement and spur each other on, and a different level of enjoyment can blossom.

Sometimes the dance-musician interaction needs a little nurturing. In a Hungarian dance workshop in Boulder some years ago, teacher Zoltán Nagy noticed the couples distributed evenly across the dance floor. No, he said—that was all wrong! He shepherded us into one corner, so we'd be crowded as in a village dance-room, and had us start by facing the tape player in that corner. We must face the music, he said, so that we (the male leaders, of course) could communicate with the band. And until we actually had a band, we should practice as if there were one!

We're still waiting for that traditional Hungarian dance band in Colorado, as far as I know. But there is a wealth of live dance music in other traditions—Balkan, ballroom, contra, flamenco, Greek, Klezmer, Middle Eastern, salsa, Scandinavian, Scottish, swing, tango, vintage, flamenco, and on and on.

The Boulder Spelmannslag, under the direction of Sharon Gillespie, has a remarkable history of 30+ years of teaching children how to play Scandinavian fiddle music for dancing.

"It's a lot of fun to be around these young musicians," says Ingvar Sodal, longtime Norwegian dance teacher who, together with Sharon, has recently established a monthly dance night just for Spelmannslag members and their families to enjoy dancing to live music. "Their youthful energy is so stimulating and as they grow older, some of them have turned into very good musicians."

Through my particular lens, I see that, as a result of many factors, international folk dancers today have more appreciation of live Balkan music. The footwork in a traditional Bulgarian pravo or Greek kalamatiano is much less varied than that of a choreographed folk dance, but with good musicians driving the tempos, playing exciting improvisations and singing soaring harmonies, and good dancers catching the excitement and building it further with inspired dancing, it can be extremely gratifying on both sides.


That's the way it should be. One year I was at Scandia camp at the Mendocino Woodlands. Folks were sitting outside after lunch, relaxing. One of the campers asked the Norwegian fiddle teacher to play a particular tune he'd played in the dance party the night before. The teacher said, "Sure. But first find me a pair of dancers. I can't play it without dancers."

## Live Music for Live Dancing?

From Scandinavian to swing, belly dance to waltz and beyond, improved recording and sound technology and easy access to a world of tunes via the Internet have revolutionized the availability of recorded music for recreational dancing.

Instead of the scratchy vinyl of a few decades ago, groups can find sublime recordings of the world's greatest musicians of today and years past. They can dance to virtuosic playing on exotic instruments, in styles that take a lifetime to master.

When I was first folk dancing in Boulder in the early 1980s, occasionally there was a party with live music. Some folks grumbled. They knew the choreography to a specific, three-minute tune, with a set number of repetitions, and the band was throwing curve balls—using a different tune, or a different number of repetitions.

International folk dancers liked to jump styles—one dance from Macedonia, perhaps the next from Brazil, Israel, Africa. Even a really good local band couldn't nail that many styles. And, although there were some stellar musicians, others weren't so good. Pitch and tempo issues could make things downright uncomfortable for the dancers. I remember Otto Verdoner telling me, "We need to encourage them, because we really want to develop live music here."

Then there's the expense of paying a band. Although musicians play because they love the music, they also need to put food on the table. Even volunteer groups, non-professional musicians, often ask a fee to perform. The cost of bringing in a good band can be the largest expense of a weekend workshop.

Perfect your Pivot, Hone your Hambo, Sharpen your Schottis! Starting September 21, Monday Night Scandinavian Dancing will offer a series of classes focusing on basic Scandinavian dance skills and accessible, fun dances. Learn the secrets of maintaining your own balance while connecting with your partner and turning effortlessly. The best part is, Scandinavian dance skills transfer to most other couple dance forms, so you will not only be learning new dances, you will be enhancing the ones you already know! We will begin with Telegangar, a Norwegian walking dance that is reminiscent of country swing in a relaxed tempo, and introduce pivots, one of the basic building blocks of Scandinavian turning dances. Pivots are also very useful in waltz and other couple dances. In the following weeks we will add schottis, basic polska, stigvals, hambo and Rorospols. The classes will build on each other, week to week, so it is helpful to come regularly. No need to bring a partner, as we change partners often, but do bring hard soled shoes because they make this dancing much easier. We usually have live music on fiddle, nyckelharpa and button accordion.
