choreographer/teacher, Richard Powers, who researches vintage dance and instructs at Stanford University, gave permission to use choreographies he had developed for Boulder's Tapestry Dance Ensemble. WYS assembled a suite of dances and costumes dating to the early 1910s, with their first performance that April.


